CLIPPINGS NEW TRIBAL SCHOOL



VED VIGNAN MAHA VIDYA PEETH has reached out to more economically backward children by opening A NEW TRIBAL SCHOOL IN VILLAGE PANCHELA, TALUKA DEVGADH BARIA, DISTRICT DAHOD, GUJARAT.

The village has a population of over 3,000, which includes 1,500 children. Majority of them work as labors earning daily wages, making it very difficult for them to send their children to school. Number of children not attending school is close to 300.

The new school has started with 32 children, providing free education to them. This includes free tuitions, books, stationary, midday meals, uniforms. and transportation to collect and drop children from nearby villages.

The school will grow every year with new students joining the school and old students going to higher classes. This school has encouraged the village people to send their children to school for quality education and a bright future.



CELEBRATION TIME

Our students at VVMVP celebrated Independence Day in all patriotic colours and enthusiasm. Hoisting of flag and remembering the teachings of all national leaders of our country marked the beginning of celebration. The school Prime Minister gave an inspiring speech with a narration of all important national events. He also spoke about his pride in being a student of VVMVP.

EYECAMP CONDUCTED ON 18TH SEPTEMBER 2008



An Eye Camp was conducted in the VVMVP School on September 18th, 2008 for the students. The Camp was sponsored by Canon India in association with Shankar Netralaya. It was held in the School Hall though the day. The camp started right after the morning assembly. Students of the nursery class were the first to get their eyes checked. Over 520 students got their eyes checked by the doctor and opticians from Shankar Netralaya.

The students' eyes were examined for normal sight defects (close/far) and other physical defects like squint in the eye, which now may be

cured if detected at an early stage. The cure could be as simple as prescribing powered glasses or may require surgery.

Many students were given spectacles with the appropriate power. Eight students were scheduled for a hospital visit for further examination and necessary medical procedure. They would undergo required treatment and surgery, if necessary. Overall it was a successful Eye Camp and we are looking forward to many more in the near future.
